

About Me


Hi all,

Mood board for jack, queen and king of clubs






The clubs playing cards have always reminded me of the plant clover, that's why I decided my set of jack, queen and king of clubs to represent it.

When I picture a heart symbol on a playing card I immediately think of the Queen of hearts from the film, that's why she was my main inspiration.


As a technique I decided to sketch the "portraits", then paint them and stick them on black paper for a more modern and stylish look.
